He appeared to them over a period of forty days and spoke about the kingdom of God." [NIV] The resurrection was the catalyst for spreading the hope that Christ brought to the world. The early believers had an unshakable confidence in the power of Christ because they saw it with their own eyes. How is your confidence moving you into action?

We receive encouragement and support when we gather together!
✓ PRAYER	Loving God, help me to seek out relationships with other believers. I want to grow my knowledge of you and strengthen my faith. Help me to give of my time to connect with others who need my support. Amen.

✓ SCRIPTURE	Psalm 89:1
✓ THOUGHT	"I will sing of the LORD's unfailing love forever! Young and old will hear of your faithfulness." [NLT] When we have encountered God and our lives have been transformed, we can't help but share about it! The work of God's spirit of love in us is something that has the power to truly make a difference for someone else. This should be an encouragement to us to boldly share about God's goodness.
✓ PRAYER	Almighty God, thank you for the ways you are always working in my life. The evidence of your love is clear in my life, and I pray for the courage to make it known to others who need it in their lives. Amen.

		with everyone." [NIV] The early believers were instructed to maintain unity and connection in some specific ways. How do these guidelines work in your life? Do you find it difficult or easy to maintain peace in
✓	PRAYER	your relationships? Ask God for guidance. God of peace, change my heart so I can see the people in my life through your eyes. Empower me to be a source of strength for those who need my support. Grow my patience and longing for unity. Amen.

√	THOUGHT	"Share each other's burdens, and in this way obey the law of Christ." [NLT] Take a moment to bring to mind someone specific who is going through a hard time right now. DIGGING DEEPER

✓ Intro

If you were raised on a version of Christianity that relied on the Bible as the foundation of faith, a version that was eventually dismantled by academia or the realities of life, maybe it's time for you to change your mind about Jesus. Maybe it's time for you to consider the version of Christianity that relies on resurrection of Jesus as its foundation. If you gave up your faith because of something about or in the Bible, maybe you gave up unnecessarily.

✓ Reflect

- What were you taught as a child about the Bible's significance? Who were your most important faith influences at the time? Would you say that was the foundation of your faith?
- At what point did you begin to question your childhood faith? What influenced your doubt?
- If you were to ask your friends why they don't follow Jesus, what do you think they would say? What might they say is the foundation of the Christian faith?
- Read Acts 2:22-39. Many in Peter's audience were stopped in their tracks at his words. What moved them most about what he said? How can his message encourage us to change our minds about where to place our confidence?
- As you think about the next generation and consider raising kids and grandkids, what problems do you think we face in helping them establish a firm foundation of faith?
- Think about the early church and its people, who put their complete trust in Jesus without having a Bible in front of them. What would need to change in order for you to have that kind of faith? How can you begin to explore a faith that's built on the foundation of the resurrection of Jesus?

✓ Consider

When you lose your fear of death, all fear is gone. The disciples' hope was not in the Scriptures but what they had seen and heard. The reason for our faith in Jesus--and thus our hope--is the resurrection. We must reclaim this hope for the sake of the generation that left faith and for the sake of future generations as well.
