SCRIPTURE

"My old self has been crucified with Christ. It is no longer I who live, but Christ lives in me. So I live in this earthly body by trusting in the Son of God, who loved me and gave himself for me." DIGGING DEEPER

- ✓ PRAYER God, we acknowledge that you are already here. May our hearts be open to your presence and direction. Amen.
- ✓ BIG IDEA During this series, we could easily spend small group time debating the hot topics; however, since our goal is to build unity, the group discussion guides are centered around that concept. Unity requires that we practice the Golden Rule. When we engage with someone with whom we disagree, we want them to truly consider our point of view. That means we must be willing to do the same!

✓ DISCUSS

- Discuss necessary qualities of someone who can fully explore and entertain an opposing viewpoint. Do you struggle to do this when you are engaged in a disagreement? Can you pinpoint why?
- If each party involved in a discussion was assured that the other party would fully consider both sides of the argument, how might that change the tone of the discussion?
- In the Sermon on the Mount found in Matthew 7:12, Jesus says, "Therefore, you should treat people in the same way that you want people to treat you; this is the Law and the Prophets." [CEB] Why do you think these words of Jesus are often referred to as "The Golden Rule"?
- There is a small but impactful distinction worth discussing. How often do we default to treating others the way we *have been* treated, instead of the way we *would like to be* treated? Do you struggle with this?
- Why do you think we find it difficult to base our actions on the "desired future" as opposed to the "experienced past"? How could each choice impact unity in your personal relationships and within the church?
- Pray Loving God, we thank you for the wisdom you give to us about relationships. Help us to grow in love for one another and to always keep in mind that you taught us to love even when we feel mistreated or misunderstood. Strengthen us as we treat others like we want to be treated. Amen.
