 - Can you recall the last "merciful deed" you carried out? What prompted you to do it?
 - Write down one kind thing you could do to help someone this week.
- When you think of the most vulnerable members of your community, what issues or hardships spark a passion or extra level of empathy in you? What is a new way you could involve yourself in serving that population of people?
