"There is one Lord, one faith, one baptism, and one God and Father of all, who is over all, through all, and in all." Digging Deeper



Intro

The Lord's Prayer is something many know by heart but perhaps haven't intentionally studied. Its deep meaning and application is powerful in the life of a Christ follower.

Reflect

- Read Jesus' prayer in Matthew 6:9-13 aloud. The Lord's Prayer concisely covered a wide range of topics, from the lofty ("Bring in your kingdom") to the every day ("Give us the bread we need for today") [CEB]. Are there topics you tend to avoid praying about? Why?
- Some feel that maybe God is uninterested or that they need to impress God with the words they choose when they pray. How comfortable are you with being yourself when you are talking to God?
- "Abba" was the Aramaic term Jesus used to address God. It was a respectful
 but intimate way to address one's father. When you think about your
 relationship with God, are you comfortable with an informal way of relating? Do
 you think it is important to strike a balance between reverent and informal? Why
 or why not?
- Were both of your parents trustworthy and nurturing? How can times of close connection during prayer help us grow beyond any painful gaps in the human parenting we received?
- The word used for heaven in the NIV version of the Bible is the Greek word ouranos, which means "air" or "atmosphere." How do you feel when you imagine God to be as close to you as the air you breathe, as opposed to God residing in the "far, far, away" sense that some have about heaven?
- One way to think of the word "hallow" would be to recognize something's worth. How do our thoughts, words, and actions "recognize" God's worth?

Pray

Lord Jesus, help me never to be too busy to talk with you. Thank you for this ongoing conversation we call "prayer." It is comforting to remember that I am able to be in constant connection with your love. Amen.
